Richmond Police Lead Multijurisdictional Effort Focused on Zero Roadway Fatalities 360 Blitz Enforcement Effort Runs Through Friday, August 18

WHAT: The Richmond Police Department in partnership with numerous

jurisdictions throughout the Commonwealth are conducting a focused

roadway safety enforcement effort called 360 Blitz.

Major Ronnie Armstead and officers from participating jurisdictions will speak about the coordinated effort that culminates Friday, August 18, at

midnight.

Hear about the enforcement efforts occurring along U.S 360 which passes through sixteen jurisdictions in the Commonwealth, the numbers of roadway

injuries and deaths, and the message for the community.

BACKGROUND:

The purpose of this effort is to reduce roadway fatalities involving pedestrian and vehicles on U.S 360 that runs through the participating jurisdictions. Getting people home safely is the goal.

In the City of Richmond Hull Street has been the corridor where most crashes occur in 2021, 284 crashes compared to 301 in 2022.
